After being cancelled for a year due to the Covid-19 pandemic we now have the pleasure to invite you to the 25th Nordic Mycological Congress in Skåne, southernmost Sweden. The congress will be held in a traditional way with daily field trips, lab work, an exhibition and some evening lectures - all in a nice social ambiance.

NB. All plans are still provisional due to the Covid-19 situation and the final arrangement will be subject to any legal restrictions and recommendations from health authorities.

Dates: Monday 26 September - Saturday 1 October 2022

Arrival, opening and social evening on Monday, field trips Tuesday – Friday, departure Saturday.

Place: Tyringe in the Central part of Skåne (90 km NE of Malmö).

Field trips: a variety of habitats are available within easy reach – rich deciduous woodland (with *Fagus*), sandy pine forests, grasslands, calcareous sand steppe and sand dunes. All fungal records made during the Congress will be forwarded to the public Swedish national species database Artportalen (www.artportalen.se).
